Dear Applicant:

Thank you for your interest in the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program (DMS) or Diagnostic Echocardiography (DE) Program. The information provided in this packet includes: admission requirements, point system, curriculum, and information to help students through the application process.

The DMS program is fully accredited by the **Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP)**. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) has approved a twenty-four-month curriculum. Students who complete the curriculum will graduate with an **Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree in Diagnostic Medical Sonography or Diagnostic Echocardiography**.

Graduating DMS students will be eligible to sit for the registry examinations administered by the American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonography (ARDMS) in physics, abdomen, and obstetrics/gynecology. Graduating DE students will be eligible to sit for the registry examination administered by Cardiovascular Credentialing International (CCI) in adult echocardiography. Students from both programs will be eligible to apply for the Enhanced Skills Certificate in Vascular Technology offered concurrently with DMS and DE.

Tyler Junior College is an open admissions college; however, the DMS and DE programs have selective admission. Acceptance into the program is based on objective criteria utilizing a point system and reviewed by an admissions committee. All applicants who meet the basic admission requirements will not be interviewed nor accepted into the program due to limited enrollment. Applicant ranking by the point system will determine admission decisions.

Students planning to apply for admission to the DMS or DE program must submit a complete application to the DMS/DE administrative assistant (**Rogers NHS Building, Room 243**) **no later than May 15, 2025**.

The following is the tentative timeline of **mandatory** dates:

- May 15, 2025 (Thursday)- Application deadline
- June 2, 2025 (Monday)- Interviews for top 40 applicants
- First week of June- Final Selection sent out
- June 16, 2025 (Monday)- New Student Orientation for selected applicants of each program

*If students do not attend mandatory dates, an alternate will be selected. All meetings are in the RNHS Building 1200 E. Fifth Street, Tyler 75701.

All applicants must submit a transcript showing completion of courses by application deadline. All prerequisites must be completed with a grade of "C" or greater. Applicants requiring substitutions must be approved by the Department Chair. If prerequisites are in progress, applicants must submit a letter of good standing from instructor and current grade in application submission.

Hepatitis B

- Proof of the Hepatitis B series and a titer is required for practicum rotations by July 1. Texas Administrative Code, Title 25, Part 1, Chapter 97, Sub-chapter B, Rule 97.64 requires students to have a complete series of the Hepatitis B vaccination prior to the start of direct patient care. Include in submission.
- It is highly recommended that anyone who is planning to apply to a health science program begin the Hepatitis B series as soon as possible because practicum rotations begin when the program begins.
- Traditional Hepatitis B series requires 3 immunizations:
 - First immunization
 - Second immunization one (1) month after 1st immunization
 - Third immunization five (5) months after 2nd immunization
- Accelerated Hepatitis B requires 2 doses
 - 1st immunization
 - 2nd immunization four (4) weeks after 1st immunization

Observation and Evaluation

- Each applicant must observe or job shadow eight (8) hours with a credentialed sonographer
- Four (4) hours in General/Vascular ultrasound: abdomen, OB/GYN, small parts, vascular
- Four (4) hours in Cardiovascular ultrasound: echocardiography, vascular
- Include observation log and sonographer's evaluation in submission (found at the end of packet)

Point-Based System

- HESI A2 reading comprehension score
- HESI A2 A&P score
- Previous degree in healthcare- AAS, BS, MS, MD, etc. (nursing, respiratory, dental hygiene, radiology, etc.)
- Work experience in direct patient care (at least 6 months)
 - Letter from employer confirming employment - NOT a letter of recommendation
 - Resume including date of hire and responsibilities
- Previous applicant
- Cumulative GPA
- GPA in prerequisites

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Interviews

The top 40 applicants will be interviewed by an interview committee. Applicants selected for interviews will be notified by email.

- Instructions for interview will be emailed prior to interview
- Points for interview (maximum of 100) will be added to point system for final applicants

Student Notification

All applicants will be notified of either acceptance or denial by email.

Acceptance

- Accepted- fully accepted
- Contingent- acceptance contingent upon completion of prerequisite courses

Alternate

- Listed as an alternate in the instance that someone declines acceptance or does not pass drug screen or background check

Denied

- Unfortunately, not all applicants can be accepted due to space in the lab and clinical affiliations. We encourage any student that is not accepted to apply again in our next application period

Drug Screening

- Accepted applicants will be required to pass a 10-panel drug screening with negative result after acceptance at the student's expense. More information will be provided prior to new student orientation.
- NOTE: The use of CBD oil can cause a positive test and will be grounds for denial of admission.

Criminal Background Check

- All students will be required to pass a criminal background test after acceptance at the student's expense.
- If you have a criminal record, notify the Program Chair and go to <https://www.ardms.org/compliance-predetermination-application/> or <https://cci-online.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/12/Policy-18A-Form-Pre-application-pertaining-to-Criminal-Matter.pdf> prior to applying. ARDMS or CCI will review records and notify if eligible to take the registry exam.



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Technical Performance Standards

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

Technical Standards for the Sonography Profession

The Americans with Disabilities Act requires that careful consideration be given to all applicants seeking education or employment. The Act also requires that accommodations be provided to the disabled person when proven to be reasonable. It also supports the identification of essential job functions that may be used with other selection criteria in the screening of potential applicants for a professional curriculum or employment.

The sonographer is a caregiver that plays a fundamental role in the diagnosis of a patient's medical condition. The sonographer does this by providing a collection of diagnostic medical sonograms and assisting in interventional procedures.

Implied in this caregiving role are essential job functions that require the sonographer to demonstrate cognitive, psychomotor, and affective skills. The performance of these job functions must be consistent with the expectation that Diagnostic Medical Sonographer must not place his or herself, a fellow worker, or the patient in jeopardy of physical or mental harm.

The purpose of the following is to identify the physical, mental, and emotional requirements appropriate to the profession of Diagnostic Medical Sonography and Echocardiography.

Examples of a sonographer's essential job functions

A. Physical Requirements

The sonographer must be able to:

1. Work standing on his/her feet 80% of the time.
2. Use both hands, wrists, and shoulders to maintain prolonged arm positions necessary for scanning and perform fine motor skills.
3. Lift more than 50 pounds routinely.
4. Transport, move, and/or lift patients from a wheelchair or stretcher to the examination table or patient bed and physically assist patients into proper positions for examination.
5. Push, pull, bend, and stoop routinely to move and adjust sonographic equipment and perform studies.
6. Use senses (vision, hearing, and touch) to adequately view sonograms, including color distinctions; distinguish audible sounds; perform eye/hand coordination skills required in sonographic examinations; and recognize changes in patient's condition and needs.
7. Work in a semi-darkened room for prolonged periods of time.
8. Be physically capable of carrying out all assigned duties.



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B. Mental and Intellectual Requirements

The sonographer must be able to:

1. Communicate effectively, verbally and nonverbally, with patients and other healthcare professionals to explain procedures, give instructions, and give and obtain information.
2. Organize and accurately perform the individual steps in a sonographic procedure in the proper sequence according to established standards.
3. Understand and react quickly to verbal instructions and patient needs.
4. Follow directions effectively and work closely with members of the healthcare community.
5. View and evaluate recorded images for the purpose of identifying proper protocol, procedural sequencing, technical qualities and identification of pathophysiology.
6. Apply problem solving skills to help optimize patient care and produce the best diagnostic information possible.

C. Emotional Requirements

The sonographer must be able to:

1. Provide physical and emotional support to the patient during sonographic procedures.
2. Interact compassionately and effectively with the sick and or the injured.
3. Handle stressful situations related to technical and procedural standards and patient care situations.
4. Adapt to changing environments and be able to prioritize tasks.
5. Project an image of professionalism.
6. Demonstrate a high level of compassion for others, a motivation to serve, integrity, and a consciousness of social values.
7. Interact positively with people from all levels of society and all ethnic and religious backgrounds.
